Throughout the reunion weekend, the veterans and their families enjoyed a round of golf, a tour of the Churchill Downs racetrack facility, and a Derby hat-making craft activity. The Commemoration Welcome Home program was conducted immediately after the meal on Saturday. The squadron leadership, Rick Yeh, Rich Krejsa & Bob Hull were joined by EC-47 History Site CPP co-chair Joe Martin and the Heritage Chapter Freedom Through Vigilance Association Vice President Ed Bendinelli for the presentation of the commemorative lapel pins, certificate of honor and commemorative materials to eight 6994th veterans. In addition, a special certificate of appreciation was presented to the sister of a 6994th vet who was tragically killed in an auto accident shortly after his discharge from service. She never had a chance to see him alive after his discharge and attended the reunion in hopes of learning more about his role during the Vietnam War. The ceremony included a declassified vintage operations film and the commemoration partners video.
