The 6994th Security Squadron held its 2021 reunion at the Downtown Holiday Inn, Mobile, AL from 26-28 Aug 2021. These veterans operated and maintained the electronic Airborne Radio Direction Finding equipment aboard the EC-47 aircraft deployed to 7 different locations within Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War. With guidance from the EC-47 History Site CCP co-chairmen, the 6994th reunion chairs organized a commemorative program to welcome home and pay tribute to 7 veterans and their families as part of the reunion activities. During the reunion, the attendees enjoyed tours of the Alabama Flight Works facility and the Belligworth Gardens and Home, as well as a pizza party on Friday night. The Commemorative Program was held immediately after the banquet meal on Saturday. The squadron leadership, Rick Yeh and Rich Krejsa were joined by EC-47 History Site CCP co-chair Joe Martin for the presentation of the commemorative lapel pins and certificates. A special certificate of honor was presented to the niece and grand nephew of one of the squadron members killed in action during the war. The commemorative program included a declassified operations video as well as the official commemorative video. The 6994th Security Squadron reunion received excellent program support from the EC-47 History Site CCP and the program was well received and appreciated by everyone in attendance.
